Scripture Reading: Matthew 2: 1-12.

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem ² and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

³ When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. ⁴ When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵ "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written:

⁶ "'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.""

⁷ Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. ⁸ He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him."

⁹ After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰ When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. ¹¹ On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. ¹² And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route. A time to pause, read again, pray, and reflect.

Reflection: John Stott writes "it is especially remarkable that Matthew, the most Jewish of the four evangelists (gospel writers) nevertheless portrays near the beginning of his writing the visit of these mysterious Magi, representatives of the Gentile nations, and then at the gospel's end (chapter 28) the commission of the risen Lord to go and disciple the nations". Therefore, with Matthew's gospel, from the very beginning in Bethlehem to the end of Jesus' incarnated earthly ministry in Jerusalem we see divine connections. Isaiah prophesied "arise, shine; for your light has come...nations shall come to your light and kings to the brightness of your dawn" (Isaiah 60:1 and 3). The prophet Micah (as quoted in part by the priests and scribes of Herod's court) who prophesised God's purposes 700 years before the birth of Christ goes on to say: "and they shall live secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth; and he shall be the one of peace".

The journey undertaken by the Magi was one in which they did not know the length, the hardships or the destination only the purpose, to worship God's Messiah. "In all of their sacred wisdom, in all of their vast learning, they had not yet found the wisdom their hearts were longing for. Why else would they have taken such an arduous journey if not for an aching need to satisfy a hunger that all of the worlds wisdom had not satisfied" Michael Card -author and songwriter. When the Magi are brought to Herod in secret they are being drawn into a web of deceit and lies. Evil tries to conceal itself (and sometimes gets away with it) in an attempt to legitimise itself, passing itself off as "well meaning". Perhaps Herod does such a good job of his deceit (as can often be the case) that it is only the dream (verse 12) that averts the Magi telling Herod the whereabouts of the baby Jesus.

This is a period of time unlike any other in the history of this world, filled with the work of God's Spirit, dreams, babies, angels and the supernatural. Most significantly God comes to his people in human flesh in the most vulnerable way conceivable.

What of the "chief priests and scribes", did any of them have the slightest interest to go the very short distance (9km) from Jerusalem to Bethlehem to see for themselves? When compared to the 1,150km estimated that the Magi travelled it must be abundantly clear that what separated them was not intelligence or knowledge but the desire of their hearts; one being open and eager and excited to encounter the living God the other serving a corrupt and cruel human master with their eye on the "organisation", their next promotion or rank. The chief priests would have had an excellent knowledge of the scriptures when compared to the partial parts of scripture available to the Magi, probably left to them from the exile period.

"We have come to worship him", "they were overjoyed" and "they bowed down and worshipped him" are to me the three most important elements of this passage. These men have set out into an unknown land, with no clear direction, following a star that is leading them westward. This is the miraculous reconciling work of God and as Jesus is presented at the temple (Luke 2) recall the words of Simeon and Anna, through the power of the Holy Spirit, "my eyes have seen your salvation which you have prepared for all peoples, a light of revelation to the Gentiles and for the glory of your people Israel" and "the consolation of Israel...the redemption of Jerusalem".

These are events that speak to us today, surely we must not put them away with the tinsel and baubles for another year but instead carry them with us into 2021 and into our lives, proclaiming this salvation event much as the Magi and the shepherds (from Luke2) "glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen as it had been told them". **Amen**
