

Scripture Reading: Luke 10: 38-42

³⁸ As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, he came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to him. ³⁹ She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what he said. ⁴⁰ But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!"

⁴¹ "Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, ⁴² but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her." New International Version

A time to pause, read again, pray, and reflect.

Preaching Notes: these notes are a supplement to the weekly video which can be viewed on our YouTube channel.

The sisters Mary and Martha and their respective choices as Jesus visits them are very often used as comparisons between the act of worship and the undertaking of service. Unfortunately, this has led people (our brothers and sisters) often being described or characterised as either "Mary's" or "Martha's". The passage preceding (Luke 10: 25-37 stressed the importance of loving one's neighbour as evidence of loving God and now Mary is putting all thoughts of service to one side and is at the feet of Jesus, listening to all that He says and teaches as an act of loving God. Many Bible commentors believe that this passage is about the choices we make at specific times and not about our character. Leon Morris states, "Few Gospel stories have been subjected to greater mishandling than this one. Through the centuries, Mary has often been idealized at the expense of Martha, and in the Middle Ages, Mary was used as a model to exalt the contemplative life over the active one. However, that is to misuse the text and to misunderstand the context."

To be "distracted" is to be human, Martha is busy with the preparations for her special guests (Jesus and the disciples) but at some point they appear to overwhelm her and it is when, perhaps in frustration, she requires her sister Mary, who is sitting listening at the feet of Jesus, to also take up the preparations that they both (Mary and Martha) get a discipleship lesson from Jesus about reverence, devotion, worship and service. Jesus knows all, and when he tells Martha "you are worried and upset about many things" we are unaware of what else was distracting Martha, perhaps a broken relationship, fears or anxieties? How often do we exhibit symptoms of being upset about something but the trouble lies deeper and in another area of our lives?

" Martha, Martha", the repetition of the name of a person or place normally indicates the coming of a message of special importance and of love and compassion for the person or place. To confirm this fact look at those who are addressed as such: Abraham (Gen 22:11); Moses (Ex 3:4); Samuel (1 Sa 3:10); Jerusalem (Mt 23:37) Simon (Peter) (Lu 22:31) and Saul (Paul) (Acts 9:4, 22:7, 26:14).

All of this is entreating us, today, to understand that whilst much is considered important, in truth, "few things are needed", in fact "only one", which is the devotion to God exemplified by our discipleship -following Him and coming under His teaching. "Seek ye first the kingdom of God" (Matthew 6:33), we would do well to put this verse into practise. Dr Vance Havner the American revivalist and renowned preacher gives an excellent summary, "Our sole business is to live in constant, abiding fellowship with Christ. If we become more interested in what we are doing for Christ than in what He is doing for us, we have reversed things and we shall end up as did Martha at this moment, distracted instead of devoted. But one thing is needful for the believer, to stay spiritually at His feet, hearing His word. Our hearts can sit at His feet while our hands work in the kitchen."

At all times, Jesus was taking every opportunity to teach and speak by example and we can consider that He is continuing to do this for us today. As we have journeyed through Luke's gospel in chapters 9 and 10 Jesus has been teaching us what it is to be followers, disciples, learning and putting into practise what He is teaching us. To do otherwise means we are lacking the "one thing" that Jesus says is needed devotion to and love of God, Father, Son and Spirit. **Amen** Written by Phillip Dixon
