We continue to be in the glorious season of resurrection and as a resurrection people our proclamation is:



Good morning church!

Opening Prayers:

We gather this morning in the name of The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit.

All-encompassing God, may we experience Your presence this day as we gather in our homes, join us and make us of one-accord with our spiritual family, our brothers and sisters in Bransgore, Highcliffe and beyond, along with those who have gone before us and are with You in heaven. Distance separates us from each other but we give thanks that You join us by Your Spirit. May the familiar fragrance and breath of Your peace, love, truth and power flow over us and through us.

We represent this morning Your creation, the nations and people of Your beautiful, perfect and diverse creation, men and women, young and old, from different cultures, different ethnic backgrounds, different experiences but united by faith in Christ Jesus. We represent the pain felt by all who grieve today, all who cry out

against injustice and prejudice. Lord, heal our lands and bring peace. **Amen**.

Proclamation: Each one of us is a living part of the ecclesia (the church), the "called out ones", a people not a building, called by Almighty God to bring His gospel of peace, reconciliation and transformation to a hurting and corrupted world.

Prayer of confession:

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:9

if my people who are called by my name humble themselves, pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear them from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land.

2 Chronicles 7:14

Loving and forgiving God, I confess to You my errors, my pride, my self-reliance and my lack of love for my brothers and sisters. Your word says I must love You and my neighbour as myself, I am sorry for the times when that does not happen. For the times when my good intentions are not followed by my sacrifice of self. **Father forgive, Christ have mercy.**

For the times when I have made being a Christian a comfortable status, a statement of attendance or belonging instead of a way of living my life for You and helping others to do likewise. Forgive me for the times when I have not been a good witness to others. Father forgive, Christ have mercy.

For the times when I have believed that salvation is something to be achieved, a rule to be kept, a hoop to be gone through or a hurdle to be jumped over instead of a beautiful sacrificial gift that by Your blood You freely give me. Father forgive, Christ have mercy.

For the schemes and plans of man, thinking that they will result in the growth of our gatherings instead of prayerful obedience and seeking Your will. For the sins of our world, for the aggression, the pollution, the racism, the greed and the immorality. **Father forgive, Christ have mercy.**

Pause

Father, I name the specific things for which I come to You, asking Your forgiveness.... Father forgive, Christ have mercy.

A time of silence to hear what the Lord may be saying to us today.

God of love and power, thank You for the forgiveness and freedom You have given me from my sins, heal and strengthen me by Your Holy Spirit so that I may walk today a path of righteousness with my past life of sin behind me. I am reminded that, as a believer, I am Your redeemed child, bought back into relationship with You for a price, the suffering and death of my Lord Jesus Christ.

Your Grace is an unmerited gift to me each and every day. I pray Your Holy Spirit will fill me afresh today with miraculous light, love and kindness so that I may always reflect Your wondrous glory **Amen.**

Preparation for the reading of Scripture:

Lord, prepare our hearts for the reading of Your word, help us to understand the meaning of what we are reading, may Your Holy Spirit, who inspired these words, come to us now. Amen

Reading: Galatians 1:1-12

Paul, an apostle – sent not from men nor by a man, but by Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him from the dead – and all the brothers and sisters with me,

To the churches in Galatia:

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, who gave himself for our sins to rescue us from the present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting the one who called you to live in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel — which is really no gospel at all. Evidently some people are throwing you into confusion and are trying to pervert the gospel of Christ. But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach a gospel other than the one we preached to you, let them be under God's curse! As we have already said, so now I say again: if anybody is preaching to you a gospel other than what you accepted, let them be under God's curse!

Am I now trying to win the approval of human beings, or of God? Or am I trying to please people? If I were still trying to please people, I would not be a servant of Christ.

I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel I preached is not of human

origin. I did not receive it from any man, nor was I taught it; rather, I received it by revelation from Jesus Christ.

A time to pause, read again, pray, and reflect.

Preaching notes:

Paul is astonished that the Galatian churches are so quickly turning from the one true gospel of Jesus. These are churches (Antioch, Pisidia, Iconium, Lystra and Derbe) that he and Barnabas have laboured over, prayed for and served unstintingly during a period of months and years (see Acts 11:26).

False teachers (known as Judaisers) were continuing their opposition to the true gospel of Jesus Christ as revealed to the apostle Paul. Note how Paul begins this letter; "Paul an apostle sent not by men...but by Jesus Christ and God the Father...and all of the brothers and sisters with me". Paul firstly establishes his authority as an apostle from God and from his fellow believers before "laying into" the Galatian churches.

Galatians dovetails so beautifully with the Acts of the Apostles, for example Acts 15:1 "certain men came down from Judea and taught the believers "unless you are circumcised according to the custom of Moses you cannot be saved"".

This matters because they are teaching that reliance in Christ alone is insufficient to achieve salvation. Paul reminds us that Jesus suffered and died on a Roman cross to redeem us, to rescue us from sin and bring us back from darkness and place us into God's glorious light. To start adding other conditions for salvation, like good works, adhering to laws, attending or participating in worship is not just "a different opinion" or "contrary to Pauls theology" it is completely false. Salvation as the great reformers have echoed throughout our history- comes by faith and trust in Jesus Christ alone.

Paul is rightly outraged, "if anyone is preaching to you a (false) gospel...let them be under God's curse". Paul recognises that unless this matter is challenged and overcome it will be like a festering sore and will result in the miraculous spread of the gospel to the ends of the earth being halted. John Stott, the New Testament scholar, reminds us that false teaching left unchecked will cause severe trouble to the church (the people), "the churches greatest troublemakers (now as then) are not those (non-believers) outside who oppose it but those inside who try to change the gospel. It is they who trouble the church".

The gospel of Christ was not received by Paul from a training course, he did not even receive it from another believer. He makes clear to us it was revealed to him by Jesus Christ (see Acts 9). He is not trying to win favour or make himself or his cause popular, he is proclaiming the "gospel truth" – a phrase that we used to use to signify an incredibly special and pure truth. A higher level of truth.

In summary, Paul emphasises to us that we cannot and must not accept a diluted, weak or perverted gospel. I look forward to sharing with you in the coming weeks this ongoing message of freedom in Christ, a new redeemed life, becoming ever closer to God. Amen.

Let us pray:

Holy Spirit come powerfully into my life today, fill me afresh with Your supernatural love and power. Help me to be true to Your gospel and to be faithful and clear in my understanding. Thank you for Your revelation to the apostle Paul. Strengthen me to follow Your prompting and leading and not seek to please people through human schemes or ideas but to seek only Your Kingdom. Add to our number daily those who are seeking salvation in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord and saviour. May we be a faithful fellowship of nurture and growth always living out the one true gospel . Amen.
