#### **Confession:**

You are the redeemer and I am Your redeemed child, bought back into relationship with You for a price. **Amen**

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name,
Your kingdom come, Your will be done,

Matthew 22: 15-22 Then the Pharisees went and plotted to entrap him in what he said. <sup>16</sup> So they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and teach the way of God in accordance with truth, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality. <sup>17</sup> Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?" <sup>18</sup> But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites? <sup>19</sup> Show me the coin used for the tax." And they brought him a denarius. <sup>20</sup> Then he said to them, "Whose head is this, and whose title?" <sup>21</sup> They answered, "The emperor's." Then he said to them, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's." <sup>22</sup> When they heard this, they were amazed; and they left him and went away.

This is the Gospel of the Lord , Praise to You O' Christ.

Plotting, twisting words and manipulation for one's own ends has existed since the very beginning, read the words uttered by the serpent in the garden (Genesis 3) and you will realise that a little truth mixed with a big dollop of deceit and ulterior motive amounts to a very sour and dangerous concoction that depicts humanity at its worst. The Pharisees and the Herodians were not natural allies in anything, one group staunchly against anything Roman as unclean and unholy, sticklers for the law and the other, very happy to collaborate and assist the Romans in the support of king Herod. What united them was the threat that they perceived was coming from Jesus and his followers, the change of the status quo -the upturning of the current order- would have severe personal implications for them all, their power, influence and cosy arrangements would end. Verse 16 is such a clear "buttering-up" before the hammer blow falls, the soft velvet interior of an iron glove. How I long to hear these words said of Jesus, "sincerity, absolute truth, Godly teaching and no partiality or deference" apply to our fellowships. Perhaps you do also.

Jesus has their exact measure, of course He does, He knows their hearts. Can anything be hidden from God?

The wisdom and meaning of His answer is an important lesson that is not just for that day to those who were seeking to entrap Him in His answer, it is teaching that opens for us an understanding of the temporal and the eternal, the earthly and the heavenly. As followers and disciples of Jesus (Christians) we have a dual citizenship – of earth (Caesar) and of heaven (God). Jesus instructs us to be salt and light, a city on a hill (Matthew 5:13-16). This is a dual citizenship that exists now, the apostle Paul spoke of our citizenship of heaven (Phil. 3:20) and us being ambassadors (2 Cor. 5:20) to the world in which we live. If Christians are absent from the public sphere (the marketplace) and the Government (the emperor) then all of those things are poorer for it. The integrity, humility, honesty and compassion that are the marks of our faith must be outworked in our presence and participation in the world. Jesus does not say "pay only what you can get away with" or "avoid it if possible". Give to the state (the emperor) what are the state's rightful possession and to God the things that are God's.

Some believe that our role as Christian is disruption, revolt and the extreme non-cooperation to our system of government. When Archbishops are being very critical and outspoken, when clergy are getting arrested at well know marches or demonstrations, how does this fit with this response from Jesus to this band of trouble makers and malcontents or from the words of the apostles Peter "fear God and honour the emperor" (1 Peter 2:17) and Paul "petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness" (1 Timothy 2:1-2, Romans 13:1)? Please do not think that these scriptures are a reason for us not to speak out against injustice from wherever it may come and it is correct that we must not condone or cooperate with systems of hate or oppression (Nazism, terrorism, Racial segregation etc.) In the words of the popular hymn "I vow to thee my country", we recognise that there is another "country" which is "most dear to them that love her, most great to them that know" and that is God's Kingdom.

Those that heard the answer Jesus gave were "amazed", may we be continually amazed at God's love for this world and that His offer to us of renewal and eternal life is just awaiting our acceptance. **Amen** Phillip Dixon
