Christmas Day is such a very special day in our Christian year. In Jesus we have the birth of hope, and this year, perhaps more than any, the hope and love of Jesus is so important to share with our families and friends and all who are lonely, bereaved or anxious.



Opening words:

Behold I bring you news of great joy! The Word became flesh; He lives among us and we see His glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth.

Lighting the Advent Candle:

We light again the first candle in anticipation and feel hope rising up within us. We name it HOPE.

We light again the second candle as we choose to be a peaceful presence in the midst of our anxious world and call it PEACE.

We light again the third candle remembering that God has replaced our mourning with the oil of gladness, we name it JOY.

We light again our fourth candle reminding us of God's transforming love. God's greatest promise fulfilled; we name it LOVE.

We now light our central candle, white, to signify the purity of Jesus.

Joy to the world – the Lord has come! Jesus is the light of the world – a light no darkness can ever put out.

Hymn: Light a candle in a darkened place StF 174 Sing/read/pray/proclaim.

Light a candle in a darkened place, in its flame see hope on every face, Christ our Saviour will be born, heralding a brand new dawn, so let it burn.

In the darkness, see the coming light, Word of God speaks through the darkest night,

Scripture Readings: Isaiah 9:2-7, Titus 2:11-14, Luke 2:1-20.

Reflection: The birth of Jesus is foretold in the prophesy of Isaiah, recounted as the actual event by Luke and the purpose of the birth explained by Paul in his letter to Titus. Verse 11 of Titus is surely our clarion call of the day: "for the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all". The offer of salvation is indeed for all but sadly not all will receive it.

In the same way as the angel of the Lord (Luke 2:10) says "I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people". When the shepherds share the news of what has taken place "all who heard it were amazed" (verse 18).

The birth of Jesus is for all people, family friends and the whole world. Let us play our part, strengthened by God's Holy Spirit to bring this incredible message of joy to all.
