Sunday 11th April 2021 "Jesus provides for His Church" John 21:1-14.



Good morning church!

Opening words: Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! Know that the Lord, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name! For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations **Amen** Psalm 100:1-4

Prayer: Loving God, as we gather this morning in our homes join us and make us of one accord with our spiritual family, our brothers and sisters in Bransgore, Highcliffe, in many places beyond and the saints in heaven. We are separated by distance but not in our love and devotion to You. We welcome Your Holy Spirit to flood our homes and our lives afresh this morning, may the familiar fragrance and breath of peace, love, truth



and power flow over us and through us just as it did to the first disciples as they hid in a locked room those many years ago.

We represent this morning in our gathering the nations and people of Your beautiful, perfect and diverse creation; we also represent the emotions of our nation today, we are the hurt, the lonely, the fearful, the sick, the bereaved and the tired, yet above all we are a people of the Resurrection, full of Your promise of new life and Alleluia is our cry!

May our worship this morning draw us ever closer to You Lord, be our living hope and comfort. We love You and we worship You. Strengthen us for the days ahead.

Prayer of Confession:

When we repent in sorrow and confess our faults, our frailty and our weakness, You Lord, being faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. We confess our sins collectively.

Lord Jesus Christ we confess that we often fail You as did Your first disciples; our good intentions are not always matched by our sacrifice of self. Our self-reliance results in us being less dependent on You. Lord forgive, **Christ have mercy.** We sometimes lack the boldness and courage to proclaim You and Your mighty deeds of power and love, particularly at this time of resurrection, with friends and family who do not know You. To challenge the narrative of this world with its greed and self-satisfaction and to stand up, secure in Your promises, requires a strength that you offer to us by Your Holy Spirit but we are often unwilling to accept. Forgive us for the negative words or thoughts that we allow to rise up in us. Lord forgive, **Christ have mercy.**

For the times when we have not believed in the importance of Your Church. You Lord are the head of the body -the Church- and we are sorry when we do not recognise or not proclaim your Headship over us. Help us to know that it is always Your desire to work in us and through us and forgive us when we are not obedient and willing participants. Lord forgive, **Christ have mercy.**

Pause

Lord Jesus, I name the specific things for which I am asking Your forgiveness... Lord forgive, **Christ have mercy.**

A time of silence to hear what the Lord may be saying to us today. To rest in His presence, to know in your heart His perfect peace, a time to accept His offer of forgiveness and be washed clean of sin.

Words of Assurance:

God of love and power, thank You for the forgiveness and freedom You have given me from my sins, heal and strengthen me by Your Holy Spirit. I am reminded that, as a believer, I am Your redeemed child, bought back into relationship with You for a price, the suffering, death and resurrection of my Lord Jesus Christ. Your Grace is an unmerited gift to me each and every day. Scripture Reading: John 21: 1-14

Afterward Jesus appeared again to his disciples, by the Sea of Galilee. It happened this way: ² Simon Peter, Thomas (also known as Didymus), Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two other disciples were together. ³ "I'm going out to fish," Simon Peter told them, and they said, "We'll go with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

⁴ Early in the morning, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus.

⁵ He called out to them, "Friends, haven't you any fish?"

"No," they answered.

⁶ He said, "Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some." When they did, they were unable to haul the net in because of the large number of fish.

⁷ Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" As soon as Simon Peter heard him say, "It is the Lord," he wrapped his outer garment around him (for he had taken it off) and jumped into the water. ⁸ The other disciples followed in the boat, towing the net full of fish, for they were not far from shore, about a hundred yards. ⁹ When they landed, they saw a fire of burning coals there with fish on it, and some bread.

¹⁰ Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you have just caught." ¹¹ So Simon Peter climbed back into the boat and dragged the net ashore. It was full of large fish, 153, but even with so many the net was not torn. ¹² Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." None of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. ¹³ Jesus came, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. ¹⁴ This was now the third time Jesus appeared to his disciples after he was raised from the dead. New International Version.

A time to pause, read again, pray, and reflect.

Preaching Notes: these notes are an extract from the transcript for the weekly video which can be viewed on our YouTube channel.

The disciples see the resurrected Jesus but were not yet filled with the Holy Spirit. It is symbolic that without Jesus in their lives they return to their old way of living which is unproductive. It is only with Jesus' intervention that things start to turn out alright. How true is that of us in our lives? We need Jesus as our cornerstone to stay rooted in Him.

Fish or fishing can be seen as a symbolism of Jesus providing for His Church running through the Bible, Jesus feeds the 5,000 (Matthew 14:15-21) with 5 loaves and two fish; in (Matthew 17:24-27) Peter finds a coin in the fish's mouth; and we have the stories of miraculous catches of fish in (Luke 5:1-11) and (John 21:1-14). Finally remember Jesus saying to Simon Peter and Andrew come follow me and I will make you fishers of men (Mark 1:17). At least four or five of Jesus' twelve disciples were fishermen.

The account of a miraculous catch in John's Gospel completes a circle because Jesus first called these fishermen to follow Him. Jesus again appears to the disciples (the gospel account states this was to be the third time) yet they do not immediately recognise Him. They have been fishing all night and caught nothing. When Jesus asks the question about their success in catching any fish he already knows their answer. Jesus tells them to fish in a specific area and they obey and catch a net load of fish, 153 large fish. In this part of the story Jesus is demonstrating to His future advocates that on their own that can achieve very little, yet with His guidance the return will be enormous, He reminds them that they are to be fishers of men. Jesus will provide all that they need but they need to follow Him.

Why so many fishermen? Perhaps because that was the most common job in that area? If Jesus

had physically walked upon England's mountains green and on England's pleasant pastures seen as William Blake said, then perhaps He would have asked farmers or farm labourers as they were the most abundant occupations before the industrial revolution. However Leslie Leyland Fields gives several good reasons why Jesus chose hardworking fishermen to be his closest companions. As she herself has a background in commercial fishing, she speaks from experience.

"Fishermen are like farmers, they're completely dependent on the providence of God. We can buy the best nets that we can find, we can keep them mended, we can know where to put our nets, we can have all this human knowledge, but unless God sends the fish, we're not going to catch anything."

Fishermen already know what it means to rely on God. "So every time we throw our nets in the water, and every time the disciples threw their nets in the water, it's kind of like a prayer, it's like saying give us this day our daily bread. It's a supplication to God, Lord feed us."

Being a fisherman is not a job for one person, and neither is navigating life on earth. "We know if we're going to get anything done we have to work together...we are supposed to function together as a body."

Many of us might think that Jesus would have selected the brightest minds of the Synagogues to be his disciples. However, that wasn't the case.

"He turned away from the synagogue, He walked down to the beach. He walked down to where the people were and where they were working hard. He went to the blue-collar people and He showed them that we don't have to be smart. We don't have to be rich. We don't have to be famous. Jesus wants one thing from us. He wants us to want Him. He wants us to be seeking Him." If we want that He will provide for us, He will provide for His Church.

All of these events or situations demonstrate Jesus providing for His church. He does not provide everything that we might want, He provides everything that we need to do the work that He wants us to do on this earth and so to bring God the glory.

When we accept that Jesus will provide for us in our work we will see that what is provided is more than sufficient to do the task at hand, the provision is abundant. Our boat will overflow with fish. **Amen** Adapted from an original text written by Local Preacher Chris Slade

Offering: Had we been meeting physically this is the point when we would have taken our offering for God's work. Thank you for your continued generosity and faithful giving.

Prayer: Lord we offer up our gifts, all things come from You and from Your hand we have gratefully received, at this time of giving, Lord we gladly and faithfully bring our offering for Your work. **Amen**

Participation in God's Mission: Christianity always was at its very beginning and must continue now to be a missionary movement and the Church exists to undertake this task. Committed disciples gather to strengthen one another and enable a multiplying of disciples, "Go and make disciples of all nations baptising them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:18). In these coming weeks as we consider what it means for Jesus to be rebuilding His Church I believe we must have a sharper focus on Mission.

We may have faithfully laboured to do so in the past but perhaps now is the appointed time to look afresh at what God's will is for us, as His Church to renew (rebuild) and go into all the world -if not physically then by prayer and the generosity of our resources. This week we feature Compassion who "release children from poverty in Jesus' name."

Releasing children from poverty in Jesus' name is a mission about love. We love God, and we demonstrate our love and live out our faith by extending care to others and living out the meaning of compassion. Compassion means "to suffer with," and it combines sympathy with an active response. Because we are compassionate we act to lessen the suffering of children in poverty. We offer our programmes to the poorest of the poor, to the children in greatest need, without ulterior motive.

In this week's video Phil meets Mike Robins of Compassion and asks how we as a church can participate in the mission work of Compassion. If you are unable to watch the video please request a transcript of the conversation.
