Sunday 13th June 2021, Bible Month Week 2 "Mission"

These written worship sheets are provided for you to use as we gather as one, in our homes and in our church buildings to worship God. Our hope is that for all of us, those who attend the in-person worship and for those who don't, that these sheets can accompany us as we go through the week. To pray, read and reflect on this time of worship together and nurture us in the days ahead, not just on Sunday. This week we are in the second week of the Bible Month series using Mark's Gospel, with the subtitle of "Mission" using Mark 5:21-43.

Opening words: He stood up to read the scriptures and the book of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. He opened the book and found the place where these words are written, 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to preach the Gospel to the poor. He has sent me to heal the broken-hearted, to preach deliverance to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to preach the acceptable year of the Lord'.

Then he shut the book, handed it back to the attendant and resumed his seat. Every eye in the synagogue was fixed upon him and he began to tell them, "This very day this scripture has been fulfilled, while you were listening to it!" Luke 4: 19b-21 J. B. Phillips Translation.

Prayer of Confession: Father God we are sorry for the times when our words, thoughts and deeds have brought confusion, upset, pain and misery to others. Times when our silent inaction or participation with gossip has denied joy in our families and our fellowships. In Jesus you came for the outcast and the sinner, with sorrow we confess that we create outcasts by our lack of love. We acknowledge our need for forgiveness. our past weighs heavily; our present holds us captive and our future seems unclear. We utter a cry of repentance this morning, a shout of, 'no more Lord!'

Forgive us merciful God, wash us clean from all kinds of unrighteousness. Free us from sin's tyranny, so that our whole lives might be lived for your glory, that we might stand renewed and restored from guilt and despair. In the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour we pray. **Amen**

A time of quiet to hear what God may be saying to us.

Scripture Reading: Mark 5: 21-43

²¹ When Jesus had again crossed over by boat to the other side of the lake, a large crowd gathered round him while he was by the lake. ²² Then one of the synagogue leaders, named Jairus, came, and when he saw Jesus, he fell at his feet. ²³ He pleaded earnestly with him, 'My little daughter is dying. Please come and put your hands on her so that she will be healed and live.' ²⁴ So Jesus went with him.

A large crowd followed and pressed round him. ²⁵ And a woman was there who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years. ²⁶ She had suffered a great deal under the care of many doctors and had spent all she had, yet instead of getting better she grew worse. ²⁷ When she heard about Jesus, she came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, ²⁸ because she thought, 'If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed.' ²⁹ Immediately her bleeding stopped and she felt in her body that she was freed from her suffering.

³⁰ At once Jesus realised that power had gone out from him. He turned round in the crowd and asked, 'Who touched my clothes?'

³¹ 'You see the people crowding against you,' his disciples answered, 'and yet you can ask, "Who touched me?"'

³² But Jesus kept looking around to see who had done it. ³³ Then the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came and fell at his feet and, trembling with fear, told him the whole

truth. ³⁴ He said to her, 'Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering.'

³⁵ While Jesus was still speaking, some people came from the house of Jairus, the synagogue leader. 'Your daughter is dead,' they said. 'Why bother the teacher anymore?'

³⁶ Overhearing what they said, Jesus told him, 'Don't be afraid; just believe.'

³⁷ He did not let anyone follow him except Peter, James and John the brother of James. ³⁸ When they came to the home of the synagogue leader, Jesus saw a commotion, with people crying and wailing loudly. ³⁹ He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and wailing? The child is not dead but asleep.' ⁴⁰ But they laughed at him.

After he put them all out, he took the child's father and mother and the disciples who were with him, and went in where the child was. ⁴¹ He took her by the hand and said to her, 'Talitha koum!' (which means 'Little girl, I say to you, get up!'). ⁴² Immediately the girl stood up and began to walk around (she was twelve years old). At this they were completely astonished. ⁴³ He gave strict orders not to let anyone know about this, and told them to give her something to eat.

A time to pause, read again, pray, and reflect.

Preaching Notes:

Mark wrote his gospel - as a year in the life of Jesus - with no mention of our Christmas stories! He begins with simply a statement which I have shown in various translations, 'The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God' from the Authorised, & NIV, 'The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God' from the NRSV and 'This is the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God' from the GNB. Except for the Authorised version, all other later versions have a footnote about this verse-'ancient authorities do not have the words – 'Son of God'.

But note there is unanimity about the importance of Jesus – as the Christ - God's expected one.

Mark had a sense of urgency, and his gospel is the shortest – easy to read in one sitting! Halfway through (in Ch 8.) he asks this question of his disciples.... "Who do you say that I am?" That is still the challenge for you, and me, and everyone else today.

Many people, right up to today, have been led to Christ by being given the shortest gospel to read. Some years ago, Anthony Bloom while at a camp for young Russians, heard one speaker who infuriated him so much that he went home determined to confirm the stupidity of Christianity, by reading one of the Gospels. Guess which one he chose? Yes, the shortest! He later said "Before I reached the 3rd chapter (of Mark) I became aware of a 'Presence' the other side of my desk. I realized immediately that, if Christ is standing here alive, it means he is the Risen Christ." Bloom then lived out his faith in many costly ways for the next 70 years, finally as Metropolitan Antony, in the Russian Orthodox Church, presiding over other Bishops.

Mark saw that Jesus's mission – his 'Kingdom movement' - would, or should, in the end, overcome all earthly powers. But that mission would not be as many Jews hoped, and not necessarily in line with the strict religious thinking of that time! Jesus would disturb many on his mission, and not least by disregarding many boundaries thought to be important.

As you read the passage for today, you will find a story within a story, of very unexpected people – and both coming to Jesus in need, and of his response to each of them. What might your reaction have been, had you been there in the crowd? What feelings are aroused in yourself as you read of the two very different people in dire need?

Can you see how Jesus was widening his Mission field? Did he hold any boundaries or have preconceived ideas as to whom he should serve, or deem worthy of his help and support? Why?

What should we as Christians in 2021 learn from this reading? and can we put it into practice? **Amen** Written by Local Preacher Margaret Havers.
