Charities: At our Church General Meeting I will propose we offer support for the charity 'Safe Families' from 1st September 2025. Here's a vignette of their work given to me by Helen Hender, who is our local contact with Safe Families and who is also in touch with Nourish (Blandford Food Bank).

"Safe Families" - Connecting Families: Facing life alone can be hard, and when you feel there is no-one there to support you, it is a very scary place to be. Safe Families exists so that no-one feels alone, so we offer isolated families a place to belong. This means they feel seen, heard and understood. We do this through working alongside the local church and connecting families with local volunteers who become friends, offering care and companionship. We offer training, support and encouragement to churches and individuals. Volunteers also introduce families to places where they begin to develop their own friendships. This might be the local church's parent and toddler group, coffee morning or Sunday service.

A story of hope (as we call them) from one of the families we supported looked like this:

David's story - David is a single parent caring for four young girls. His social worker identified at an early stage that David was in need of some support to overcome the challenges of parenting. Harry, and his wife Alison, were connected to the family through Safe Families and provided weekly support for both David and his oldest daughter. In David's own words, they "did what a Nan and Grandad would do". Another volunteer was able to find two single beds which meant that David no longer had to sleep on the sofa.
